My fellow San Francisco Bay Area SCI members,

The duck and goose season is over and the SCI National Convention is vague memory in the past! SCI let us know that it was a record-breaking attendance and great success. It will be in Las Vegas again next year February 4 - 7 and will be celebrating the 43rd anniversary of the Annual Hunter's Convention!

Your own San Francisco Bay Area fundraiser was also a successful event. Thank you to all of you who supported the fundraiser – it was another fun event where we met with old and new friends. Mark your calendar for March 7, 2015 and start telling your friends and neighbors to do the same!



The dollars raised at the annual fundraiser go toward the chapter conservation, humanitarian, and legislative missions.

Last year our primary conservation project was helping to put collars on deer showing signs of hair-loss syndrome. This study will help all hunters, and even non-hunters, continue to enjoy these beautiful animals as the F&W scientists are searching for causes and solutions to this often lethal problem. As a member you read about this in our Summer 2013 BaseCamp newsletter.

Humanitarian efforts are undertaken by all of us throughout the year by participating in the Feed the Hungry events – particularly at the Salvation Army in San Jose and the Samaritan House in San Mateo. If you haven't gotten involved in this effort yet, just contact John Ware (see email and information on page 11). One of the great things to do is get your children involved as Richard Pierce did – see BaseCamp Fall 2013 for the story of Rich and his son.

We are one of the only chapters that has an active Veteran's program and, thanks to Glenn Christman's hard work, we were presented with the Chapter Veterans Award at the SCI Convention this year. Each year we support between two and four activities for wounded veterans hunting and fishing experiences.

Our Sables is also one of the strongest in the country with a very active reach for education. Each year the Sables sends youth and teachers to the American Wilderness Leadership School sponsored by SCI. Cathie Nelson and Jeana Rolsky are heading up the effort this year so give them a call. The Sables also do local educational events for children, such as a Day at the Zoo. If you want to get involved just contact any of the Sables officers (list on page 20).

The chapter continues to support a dynamic youth program helping to teach youth to shoot and hunt safely. Buck Buchanan is a Master Instructor certified by Ca DFW. He makes his time available to teach our youth safe firearms handling as well as helping to educate them on the importance of hunting in conservation – a two pronged approach to education.

Legislatively we support our California our political action committee (PAC). As a 501c3 we are not a political organization but we make it part of our goals to let you know about the many actions being taken in Sacramento and Washington DC that have an impact on our hunting rights.

These are only a few of the many things your chapter does with the funds raised not only at the annual fundraiser but throughout the year.

The next event your chapter is planning is the Annual Wild Game Dinner and Awards Banquet. See pages 8 to 10 to register, send in your hunting photos, and be sure to donate your extra wild game for the dinner. This is always a good time for families and friends.

1. Trophies must have been taken in the calendar year 2013.
2. All big game species listed in the SAFARI CLUB INTERNATIONAL BOOK OF RECORDS are eligible for entry
3. There is no minimum score to qualify.
4. Each entry will be judged based on the photo alone. The hunter may also submit a scoring sheet.

If you wish to have the trophy scored you can submit the results; SCI scoring is most preferred.

Scoring is NOT required. The following can possibly assist you.

### **Note:**

- » All entries for the awards will be judged based on their unique attributes including difficulty of hunt, type of firearm, number of entries, and hunter experience.
- » Awards for fish will be based on species, line used, size and/or length

5. Awards will be presented for the following categories: NORTH AMERICA, AFRICA, INTERNATIONAL/ASIA, EXOTICS & SELF-GUIDED, and JUNIORS plus others determined by the Wild Game Awards committee.
6. No award fee is required; however, attendance at the WILD GAME AWARDS BANQUET is required. Banquet reservations are on a first come, first served basis. Banquet fee is \$65 per person and \$40 per junior under 15. The club will pay for the first two awards; any other plaques beyond two will be the responsibility of the awardee @ \$20 per plaque.
7. A PDF file of your photo/form must accompany each entry. PDF images can be made from your photo for \$7.50 per photo if submitted with entry. Photos will not be returned. All materials can be submitted electronically to: photos@safariclub-sfbay.org.

### United States: Important Permit Deadlines

(Editor Note: The listing below includes current year information for big game hunts in each state. The listing will be maintained and updated as a planning tool even though deadlines may have passed. As The Hunting Report is "...for hunters who travel", all information below is based on nonresident status. Different license fees and, in some cases, deadlines apply to residents of the states listed.)

| Arizona<br>602-942-3000       | <a href="http://www.azgfd.gov/">http://www.azgfd.gov/</a> The 2014 deadline for pronghorn and elk permits was February 11. Licenses will be mailed to hunters who were successful in the draw by April 18, 2014. Bighorn sheep, deer, fall turkey, fall buffalo, fall javelina and mountain lion regulations should be available mid-May, with the deadline in early June. Non-permit (OTC*) lion permits are available year-round. OTC archery deer permits are also available for fall hunts. New license structure/fees went into effect January 1, 2014. Nonresidents are required to purchase a \$160 combination hunting and fishing license to apply for draw permits.  |
| Colorado<br>303-297-1192      | <a href="http://wildlife.state.co.us/">http://wildlife.state.co.us/</a> 2014 big game brochures now available. There are two separate brochures (sheep and goat in one brochure; elk, deer, pronghorn and moose in another). The 2014 big game application deadline is April 1. Results will be posted online by May 30. You must pay for one \$10 conservation stamp each year, but you can do so while applying for your special draw license (if applying for more than one species, you only need to pay for one conservation stamp). You must submit the entire license fee for your application (deer \$364, bull elk \$604, pronghorn \$364, moose \$2,009, bear \$354, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep \$2,009, desert bighorn sheep \$1,339, mountain goat \$2,009). This is the first year nonresidents have been able to apply for a desert bighorn permit in Colorado, and there are no preference points for desert sheep. Mountain lion season runs through March 31, 2014, with a new season (requiring a new license) April 1-30. |
| Idaho<br>208-334-3700         | <a href="http://fishandgame.idaho.gov/">http://fishandgame.idaho.gov/</a> . 2014 nonresident licenses are now available, including OTC deer and elk tags. Application period for controlled hunts for moose, mountain goat and bighorn sheep is April 1-30. Nonresidents applying for moose, sheep or goat are not eligible to apply for another species in the general draw. The application period for controlled deer and elk hunts, plus all pronghorn licenses, is May 1-June 5. A nonresident hunting license (\$154.75) is required for all applications.   |
| Kansas<br>620-672-5911        | <a href="http://kdwpt.state.ks.us/">http://kdwpt.state.ks.us/</a> The 2014 nonresident deer permit draw application period is April 1-25, 2014. Online or phone applications only. Nonresident deer permit fee is \$337.50; if successful in the draw a nonresident hunting license (\$72.50) is also required.  |
| Maine<br>207-287-8000         | <a href="http://www.maine.gov/ifw">www.maine.gov/ifw</a> Applications for Maine moose are due May 14, 2014. Applications are available online. Paper applications are also available, but the deadline for paper applications is April 1 (postmark or delivered). Multiple chances in the moose lottery are available: 1 chance \$15, 3 chances \$25, 6 chances \$35 and 10 chances \$55. If successful in the lottery, a \$585 nonresident moose license is required.   |
| Montana<br>406-444-2950       | <a href="http://fwp.mt.gov/">http://fwp.mt.gov/</a> . A conservation license (\$10) is required for all applicants. Applications for nonresident combination elk/deer licenses and elk or deer draw permits due March 15, 2014. Elk combination licenses are \$826; deer combination licenses are \$580. The elk or deer combination license is required to apply for special permit drawing (if unsuccessful in the permit drawing you may still use the combination license in the general elk or deer season). Moose, sheep, goat, bison applications are available and due May 1. Moose, sheep and goat tags cost \$755 each, bison tag is \$750. Pronghorn and Deer B tag deadline is June 1. Deadline to purchase spring bear permits is April 14. Bear permits are available through the miscellaneous licenses application (now online). Super tag raffle permit deadline is July 5.   |
| Nevada<br>775-688-1500        | <a href="http://www.ndow.org/">http://www.ndow.org/</a> Deadline for the mule deer guide draw is March 14, 2014. Application period for all other draw hunts (bighorn sheep, pronghorn, deer and elk) is mid-March to mid-April. A \$142 nonresident general license is necessary to apply for any tags. Tag fees are: deer \$240, pronghorn \$300, bighorn \$1,200, bull elk \$1,200. Additional application, predator control fees and convenience fees apply. Results should be posted by June 9.   |
| New Hampshire<br>603-271-2461 | <a href="http://www.wildlife.state.nh.us/">http://www.wildlife.state.nh.us/</a> Applications are available for 2014 moose permits and due May 30. Online applications encouraged. A fee of \$25 is due at the time of application. If drawn, you will need to submit a moose license fee of \$500. Results mailed to successful applicants by July 7.  |

Full license application fees are due upon application: standard elk \$555; high-demand elk \$780; standard deer \$290; high-demand deer \$375; pronghorn \$290; javelina \$185; bighorn sheep (Rocky Mountain or desert) \$3,180; oryx \$1,630; ibex \$1,630; Barbary sheep \$380. Additional fees for desert bighorn or oryx on White Sands Missile Range. All hunters must create an account within the drawing system to apply. Tutorial available online.   |

It then stood up, however, and I was able to get it at about 300 yards over sticks.

My guide was Joe for the aoudad, but John Coulter was also guiding, and we were also able to harvest a dandy little peccary, which will make a cute mount.



Accommodations were good, the food in Balmoresa, Texas was tasty Tex-Mex cuisine - which I love, and everyone was very friendly.

The only hiccup was that my rifle got delayed (TSA?), but Southwest cheerfully drove the rifle out to the motel early the next morning.

Incidentally, I used a Kimber stainless Montana in .270 WSM, with a Leupold illuminated 4-14X, which is getting to be my "go-to" rifle.
